#### **Impact Factors 2010**

Thomson ISI recently announced their journal impact factors for 2010. Both of the Society's Journals performed well in the rankings. Journal of Anatomy recorded an impact factor of 2.410, an increase of 12.9% on 2009, and is now ranked in position 3/19 in the category 'Anatomy & Morphology'. Aging Cell has a 2010 impact factor of 7.148 and is ranked in position 31/177 in the category 'Cell Biology' and in 2<sup>nd</sup> position overall in the category 'Geriatrics & Gerontology'.

#### **Cholesterol and Alzheimer's Disease**

In the current issue of Aging Cell, Andrey Abramov and colleagues examine the role of cholesterol in beta amyloid neurotoxicity and ultimately on the pathogenesis of Alzheimer's Disease. The authors found that high membrane cholesterol promotes beta amyloid incorporation into membranes and increased cytosolic calcium leading to cell death.
