# Journal of Anatomy: Blood, circulation and lung development

J. Pereda and colleagues at the Universities of Santiago and Valparaíso (Chile) report data to establish and resolve the debate over the relationship between the generation of blood vessels and initiation of circulation of blood in the lungs in utero. The study demonstrates presence of erythroblasts and establishment of capillary plexus by day 31, and new lung budding with early circulation of blood in the lungs at day 34. Aging Cell: Stay sugar-free and live longer

The relationship between sugar and longevity has been tested at the Leiden University Medical Center (Netherlands) in an intriguing study by Carolien Wijsman and colleagues. Using continuous monitoring with a subcutaneously-implanted glucose sensor to calculate blood glucose concentration from interstitial fluid in healthy non-diabetic young and middle-aged individuals, the study reports that longevity may be associated with lower overall mean glucose levels.
