

Research

The Royal Society is offering a number of funding opportunities for researchers in the life and physical sciences (excluding clinical medicine). There is a current call for research grants for "seed corn" funding for new projects initiated by research scientists at an early stage of their career (within the first 5 years) with the aim of increasing the availability of specialised equipment, consumable materials and services: closing date is 28 May 2013 (http://royalsociety.org/grants/schemes/research-grants/). The deadline for the international exchanges scheme for UK scientists who wish to undertake collaboration with scientists overseas through either a one-off visit or bilateral travel is 26 June 2013 (http://royalsociety.org/grants/schemes/international-exchanges/).

Journal of Anatomy: The diaphragmatic shoulder. Ever wondered how the diaphragm and the skin of the shoulder got to share common nerve origins? Tatsuya Hirasawa and Shigeru Kuratani at the RIKEN Center for Developmental Biology in Kobe, Japan have examined the evolutionary origins of limb and diaphragm and suggest a shared cell population during embryonic development. Aging Cell: More evidence on eating, growing old and dying. In the June issue of Aging Cell, Mirre Simons and colleagues at the Centre for Life Sciences in the University of Groningen, Netherlands present new evidence that extends the debate on the relationship between dietary restriction, aging rate, initial mortality rate and lifespan.
