Undergraduate Summer Vacation Research Scholarships 2014

Journal of Anatomy: style and performance

The relationship between learning style and academic performance is addressed in a study by Tracey Wilkinson and colleagues at Queens University Belfast and Cardiff University that involved medical and dental students across a variety of assessment types. The absence of correlation and the associated reasons are presented in their paper "Does learning style influence academic performance in different forms of assessment?" in the March issue of the Journal of Anatomy.
