Journal of Anatomy: palatine anatomy for dental procedures

The direct value of anatomy in clinical practice is showcased in their study of the localisation of the greater palatine foramen in the adult. Using 1350 skulls and CT scans, Iwona Tomaszewska and colleagues at the Jagiellonian University Medical College, Krakow in Poland have defined spatial localisation of the greater palatine foramen relative to the maxillary molar teeth. Aging Cell: motors in men, replicometers are more than odometers

Most of us recognise the mileage reading in an odometer in a car. In humans, our odometer is located at the ends of the chromosomes. What do they count? Cell division cycles. But experimental evidence suggest that they do other fascinating and critical stuff as well. You can update your understanding of telomeres by reading the current status of knowledge about our replicometers in "The replicometer is broken: telomeres activate cellular senescence in response to genotoxic stresses" by Anitha Suram and Utz Herbig at the NJMS Cancer Center, New Jersey, USA published in the October issue of Aging Cell at http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1111/acel.12246/full
