Obituary: Dr Majorie England BA PhD

Dr Marjorie A. England was a distinguished member of the University of Leicester Medical School. She joined the Anatomy department soon after its inception and played an important part in establishing the teaching of Human Morphology to many generations of Medical students. Her artistic flair enabled her to present the subject to maximal effect both in the dissecting room and in her lectures. In addition, Marjorie was an expert electron microscopist and used the technology extensively in her research work. With the assistance of George McTurk she established a scanning EM facility in the department and collaborated with others in a variety of projects. She joined the Anatomical Society in 1972, and was Vice-President of the Institute of Anatomical Sciences before becoming its President in 1999. Following retirement, Marjorie developed and extended her artistic interests as well as her lifelong commitment to the role of women in science. Journal of Anatomy: osteons on the edge

We know about osteons but the way their cavities alter in size in an intriguing interplay between the osteoblastic cell membrane, collagen type VI, and the membrane proteoglycan NG2, forms the basis of a study by Yokihiro Kohara and colleagues at universities in Tokyo. The correlation between collagen type VI and osteonal cavity size in developing bone is explored in a paper entitled" accumulation of type VI collagen in the primary osteon of the rat femur during postnatal development" and you can read more about the study in the May issue of the Journal of Anatomy at http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1111/joa.12296/full
